INDUCTIVE BIBLE STUDY

Procedure Summary:

You will enhance comprehension when you...

- 1. READ a book of the Bible 2 3 times straight through.
- 2. WRITE out the central theme of the book. Ask yourself: a) Why was this book written...what is its purpose? b) What idea or principle seems to be repeated in the book?
- 3. RESEARCH to the best of your ability the particular audience, authorship, time, place and circumstances surrounding the book.
- 4. REREAD through the book carefully and give titles to each paragraph and chapter in the book. NOTE: The titles of the paragraphs should tie into the title of the chapter and the chapter titles should enhance the theme of the book. (NOTE: Pay close attention to repetition, focus and emphasis in the text)
- 5. REMOVE from each paragraph a principle, a foundational truth, a rule of action or conduct.
- 6. RESPOND appropriately to the principle. Ask: a) In light of what I now know...how should I respond? (ie. should I...love, work, encourage, weep, give, trust, change my attitude?) b) Where have I fallen short? (confess sin) c) What is it about this text that makes me thankful? d) How can this passage better my relationship with God?
- 7. SHARE in humility with another person what the Lord has taught you. NOTE: If you are not living it, don't teach it!!!
